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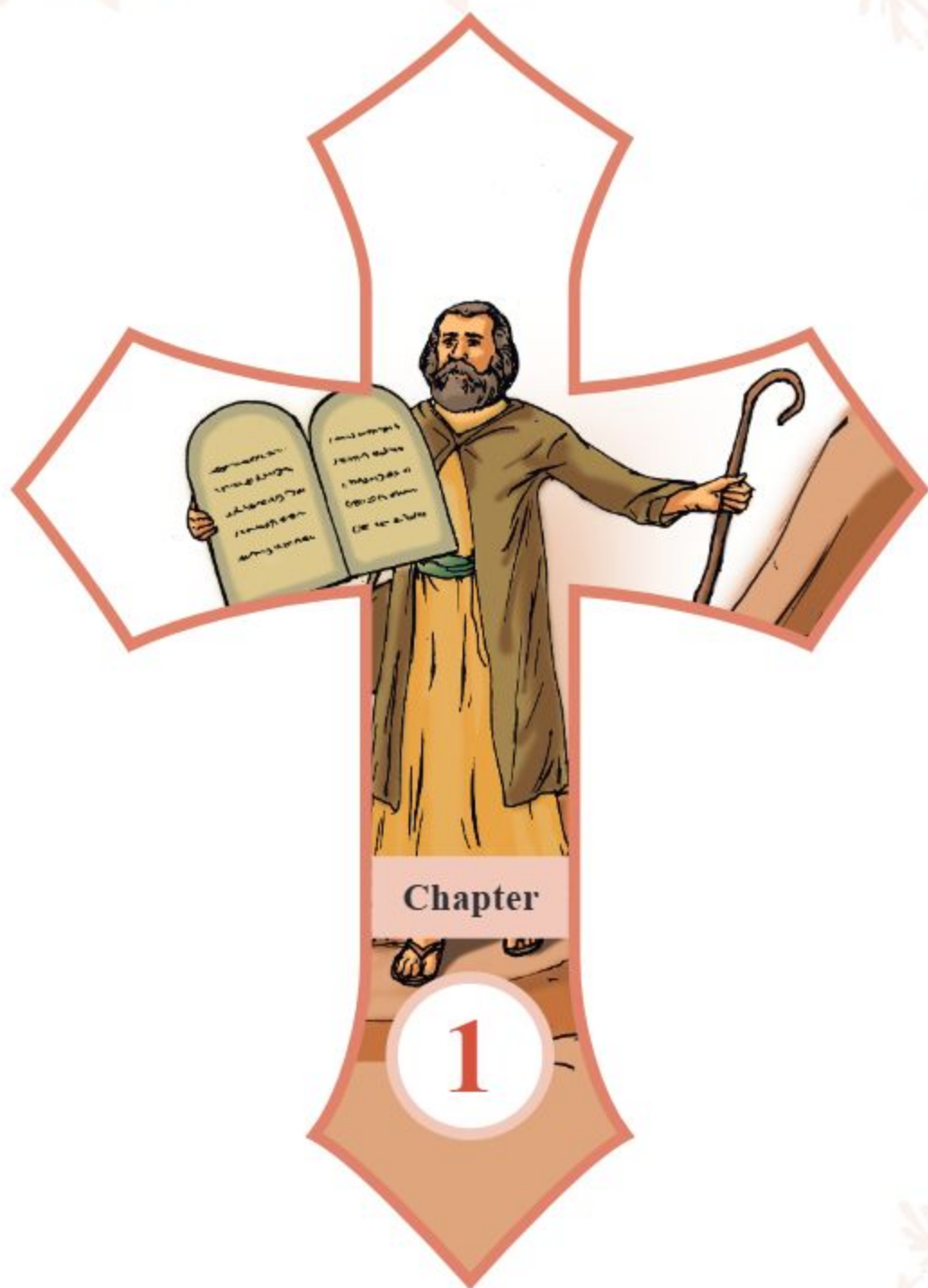

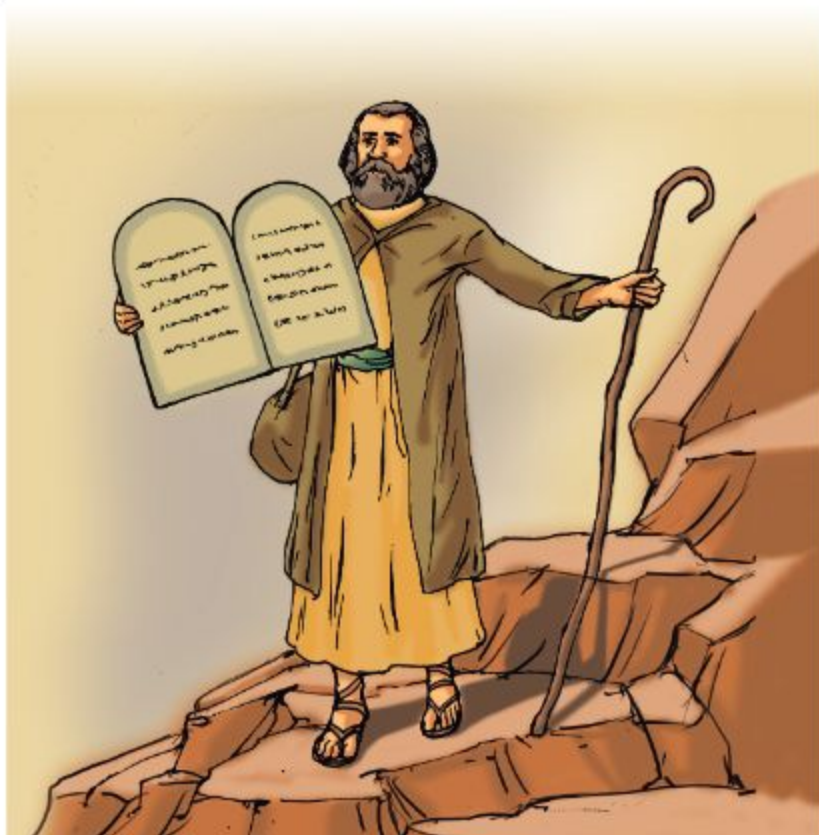


Chapter - 1

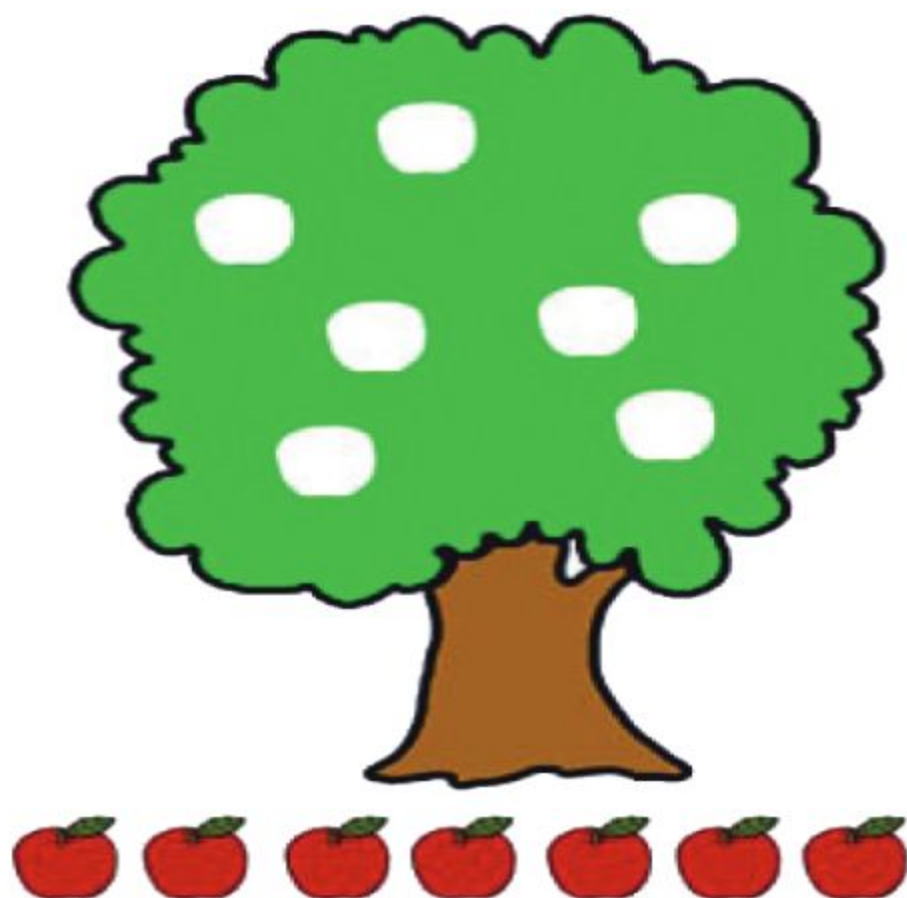
Ten Commandments of God

First Commandment

We will love Lord God with all our heart, all our soul and all our mind.

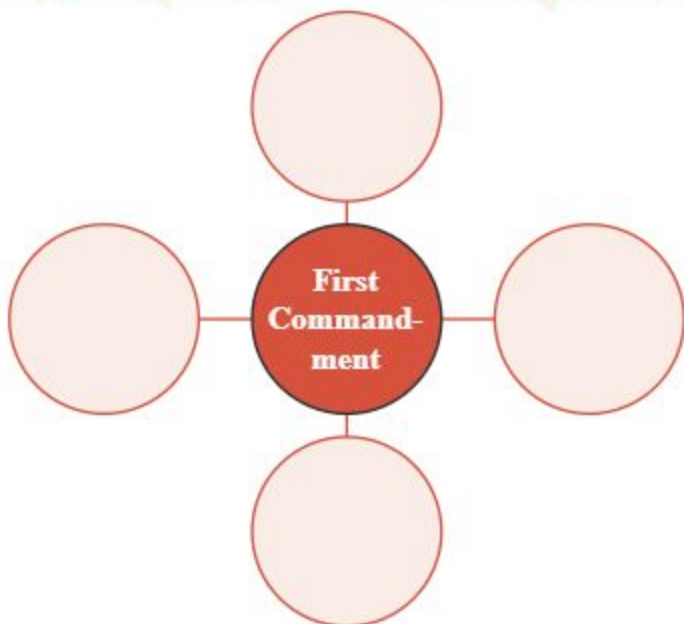
The Lord God always wants us not to worship any god but only God. We should not set up any statue/ image/ idol for ourselves. Never prostrate before them. The Lord God always inspires us to serve and worship only Him. He wants us to show honour and respect to only God.

Second Commandment

“You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.”

Lord, God is almighty and great. He is Holy. It is our sacred duty to give thanks and gratitude to Him. We constantly obey Him and possess His holiness and purity. We remain faithful and respectful to Him. We should not dishonour Him in any way. We will not take God's name in vain, not spoil His dignity and defile Him. It is frequently seen that we use God's name for our own benefits or interests. We will not curse anyone in the name of God. In no way will we utter the name of God in vain.

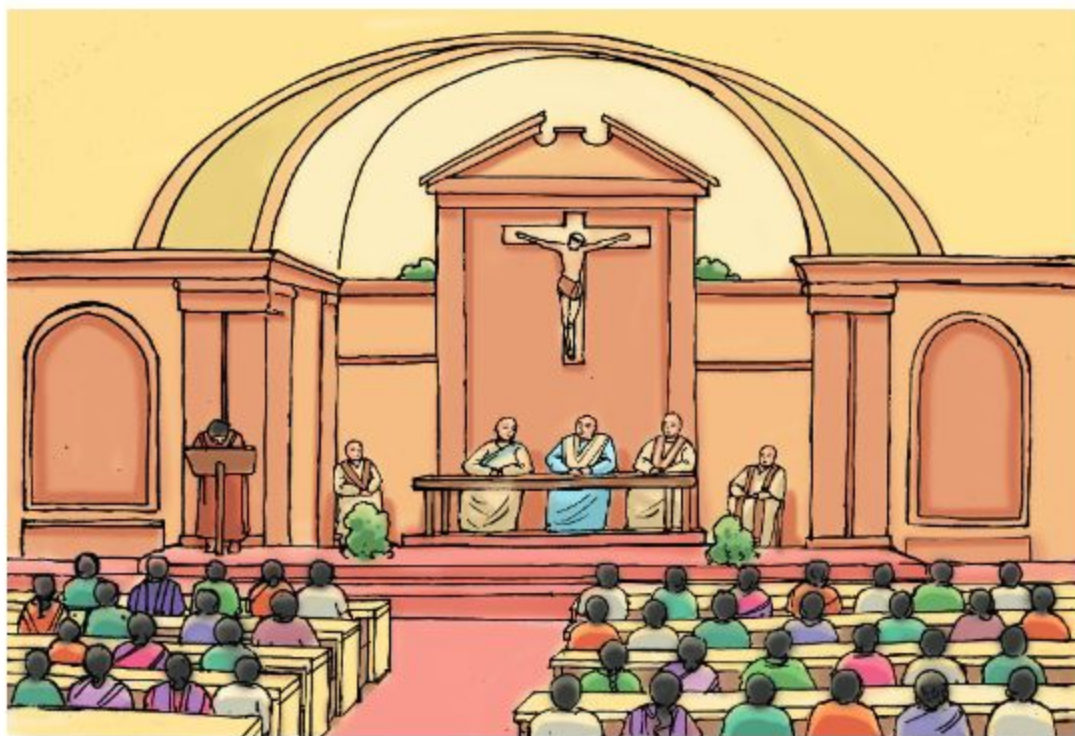
Third and Fourth commandments

We have already learnt about some of the Ten Commandments. Today we will try to learn about two more commandments.

Third Commandment

“Observe the Sabbath” (Sunday)

God completed all His creation and rested on the seventh day. He blessed the seventh day and made it Holy. Sabbath (Sunday) has been created for human being. Jesus himself has observed Holy Sabbath (Sunday). Sunday is the day of Jesus’ resurrection and the Sabbath. We observe Sunday as the Sabbath with holiness . On that day we participate in worship and in the Lord’s Supper. On that day, we do various charitable works and acts of kindness. It is the sacred duty of each of us that we should observe the Sabbath properly.

Seema's family is very religious. Everyday they pray and read the holy Bible. They follow the message of the Holy Bible. Their days were passing in this way very peacefully. For the past few days her brother Robin has been absent from prayer showing different excuses. Seema's mother was very worried. Suddenly one day Seema saw that her brother Robin brought a statue of a snake and kept it in the house. Seema was surprised. She questioned Robin. He remained silent without answering. Seema quietly saw that Robin is worshipping the snake. Seema hugged Robin and started to cry. She said, “Brother what are you doing? We all know that we cannot worship any image except God alone.” She cried and requested Robin not to worship such image again. Robin was very sad seeing

Seema weeping. He felt sad and apologized to Seema. Robin hugged Seema and promised that he would never do such activity again.

“You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in Vain.”

Shuvro is a very intelligent boy but very poor. But he is very gentle. He never scolds anyone. Even though he is poor, he always remembers God and thanks Him for everything. He never takes the name of God without any reason. He does not speak against Him unnecessarily too. To test him one day his friend Sameer asked him, “You are a very good boy. How many times a day can you utter the name of God?” Understanding Sameer’s trick Shuvro said very simply and clearly, “I remember God with respect according to my need. I don’t utter God’s name unnecessarily.” Sameer was a bit shy after hearing Shuvro’s words and said, “I am very sorry for testing you like this. I apologize for my mistakes. From today I shall not take the name of the Lord God in vain.”

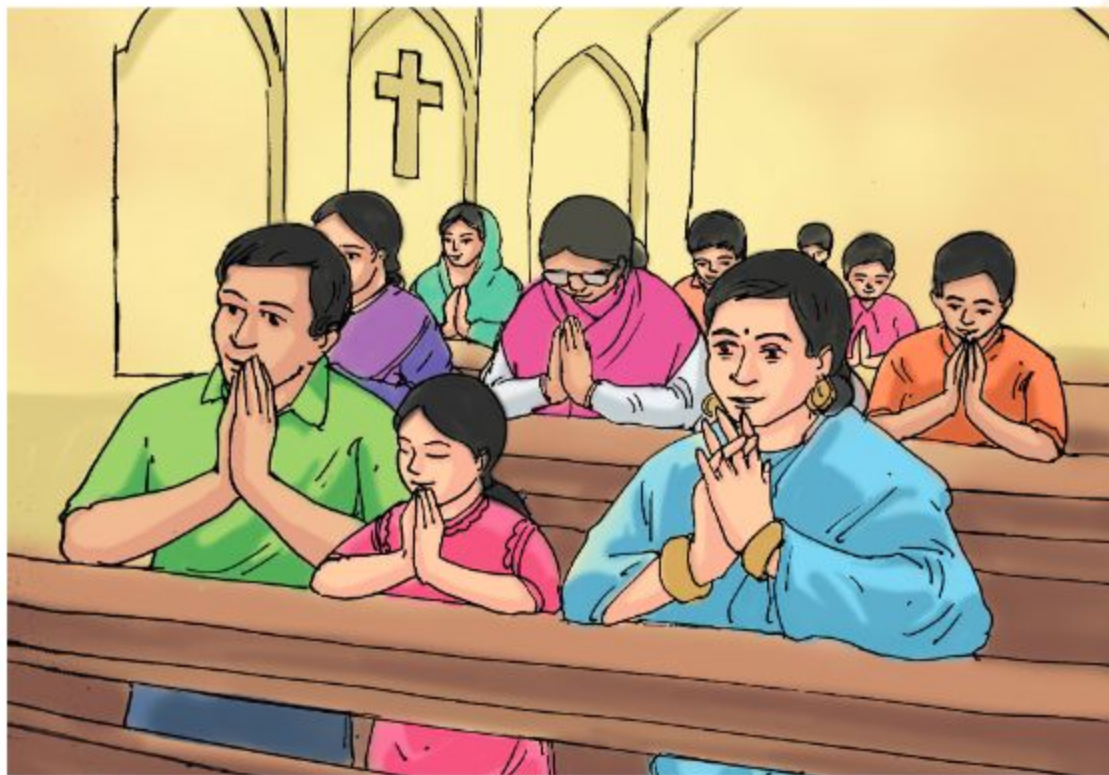

“You shall remember the Sabbath and keep it holy”



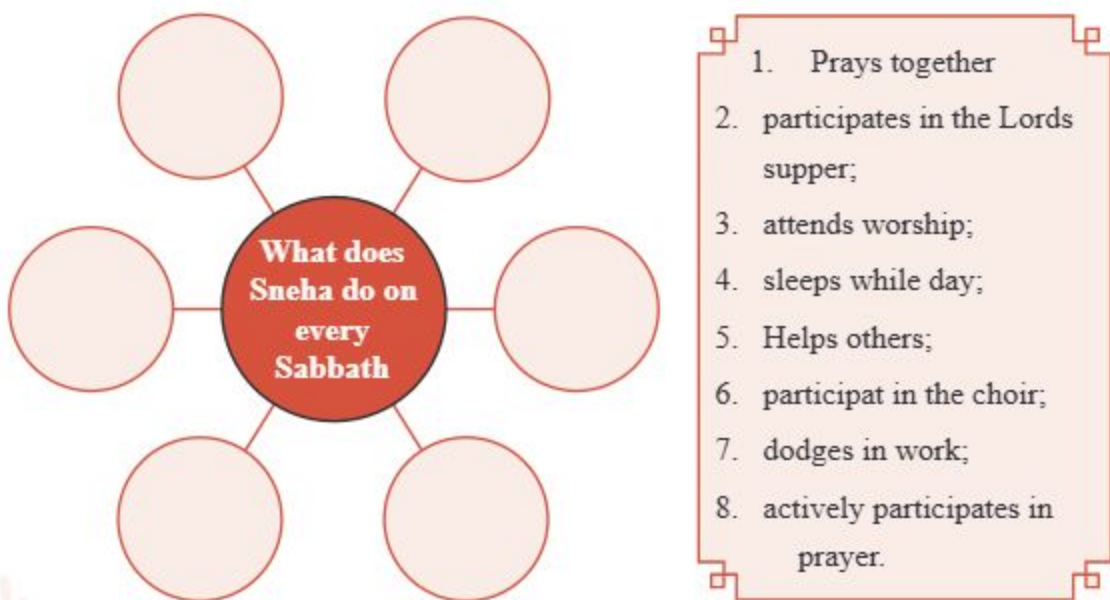
Worshipping devotees

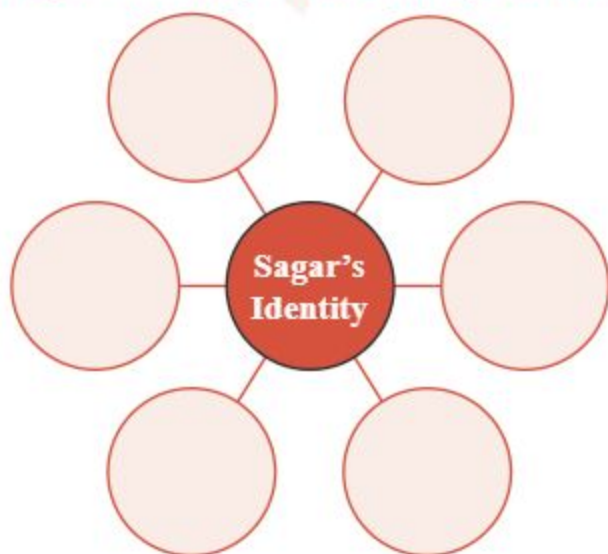

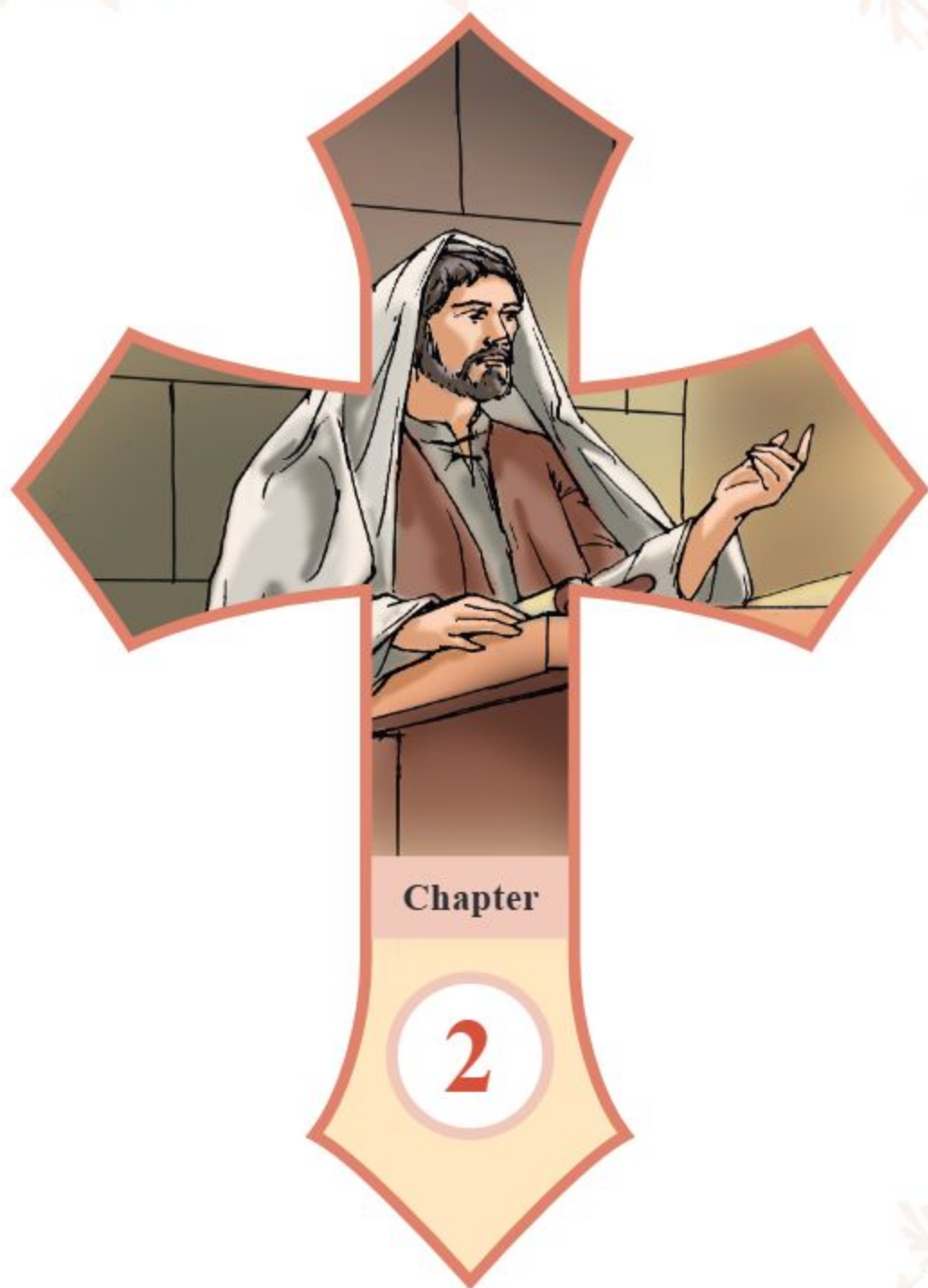

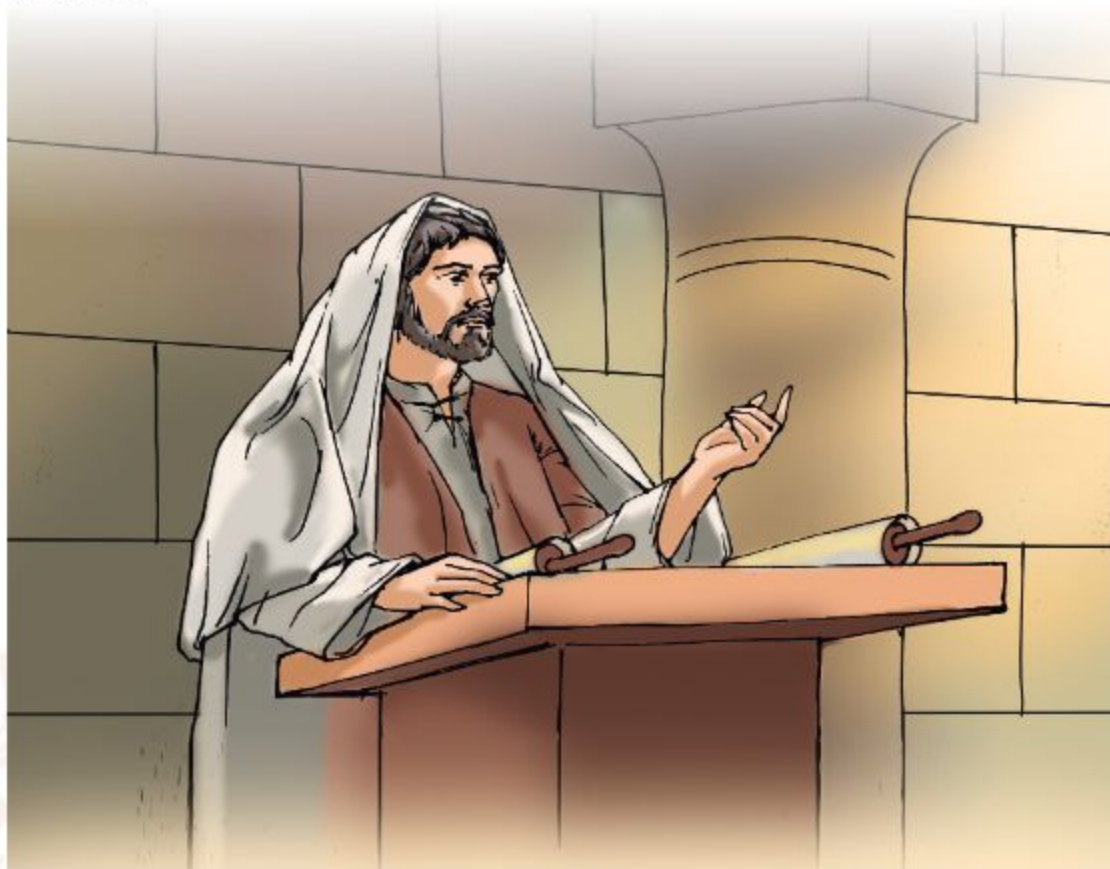




Chapter - 2

Jesus at the Synagogue



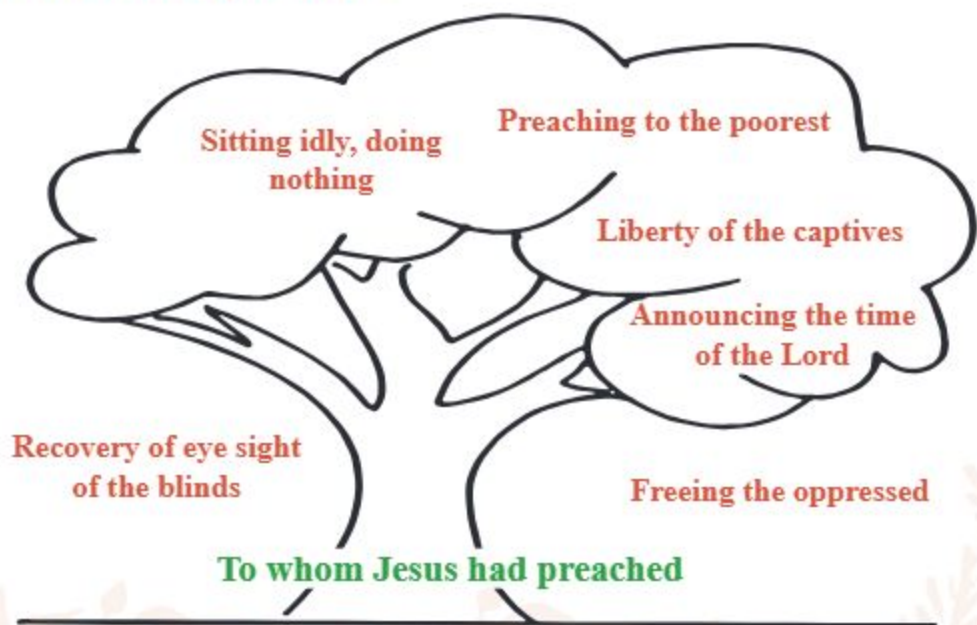

Preachings of Jesus Christ

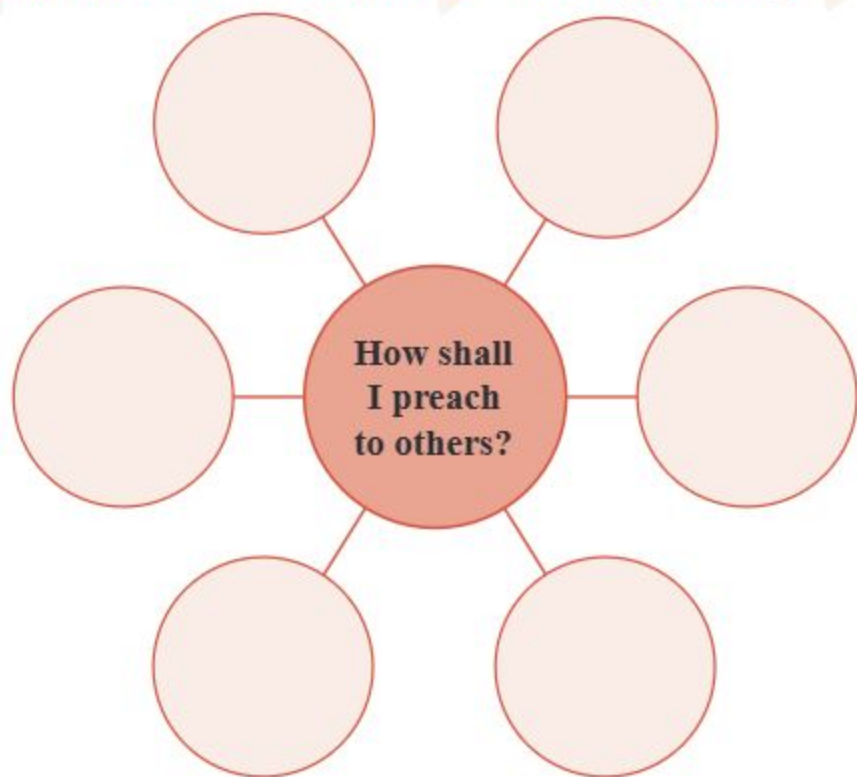
(Luke 4:17-21)

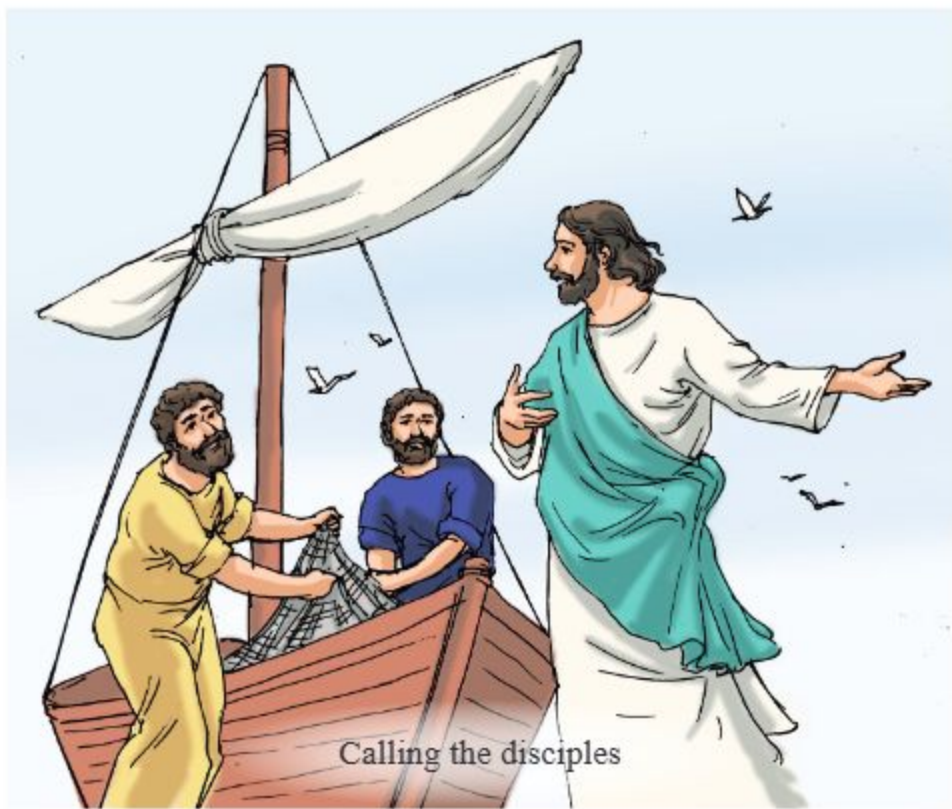


Lesson: 2

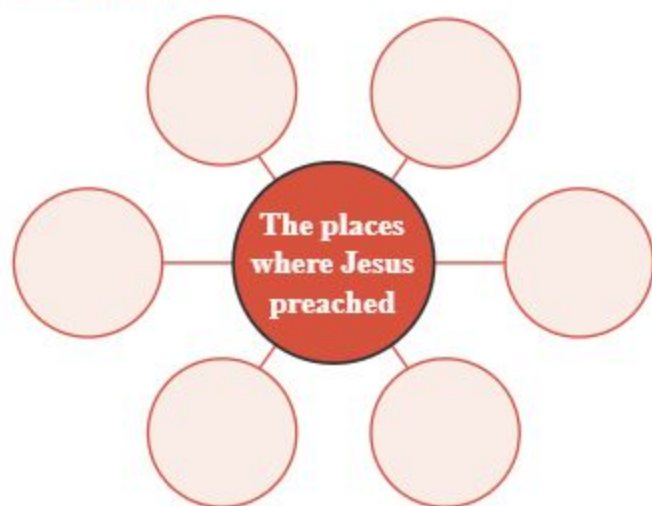

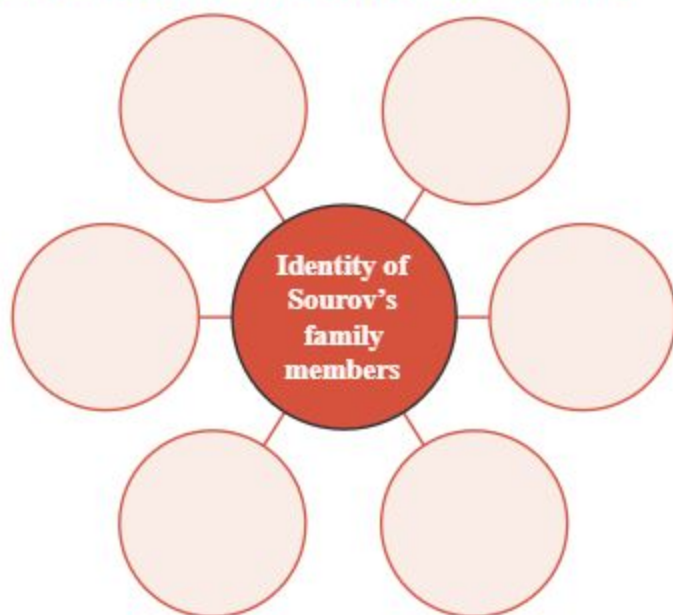

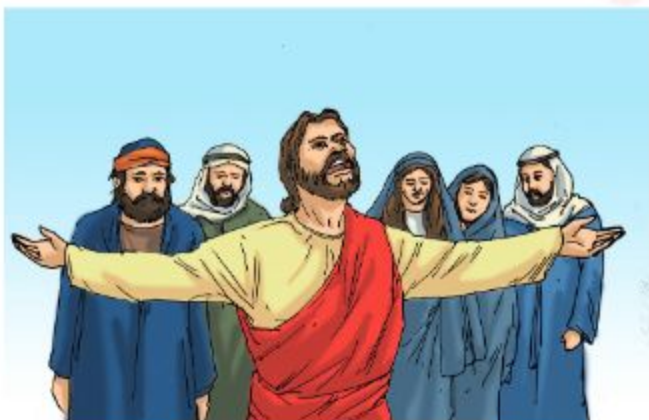


Lesson: 5

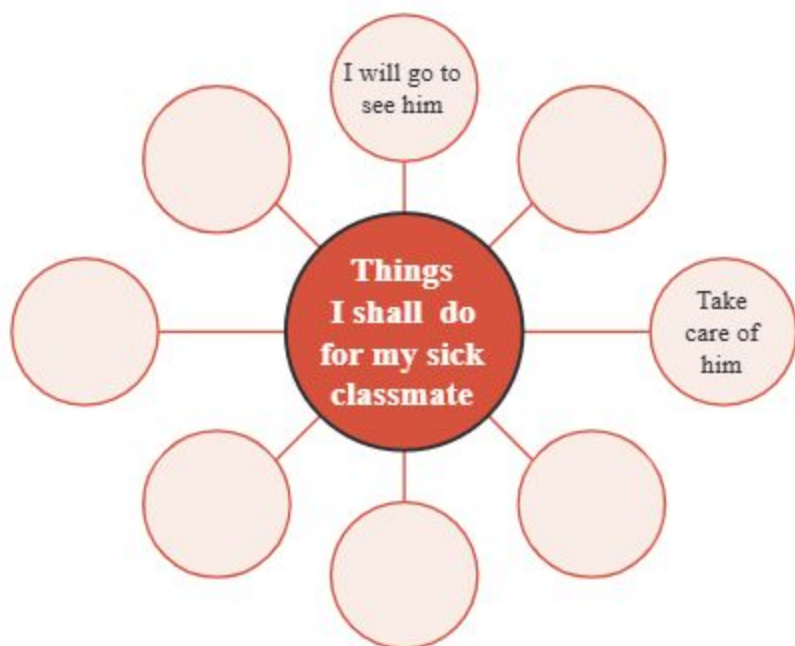
Jesus the spiritual healer

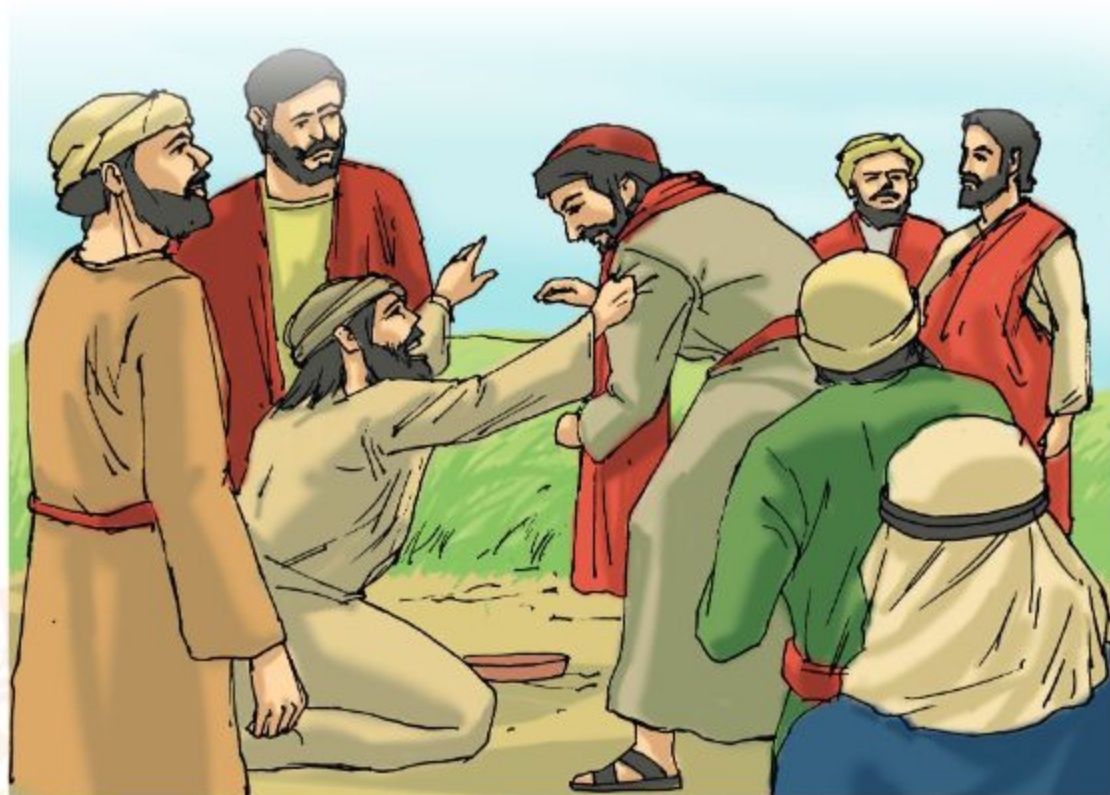

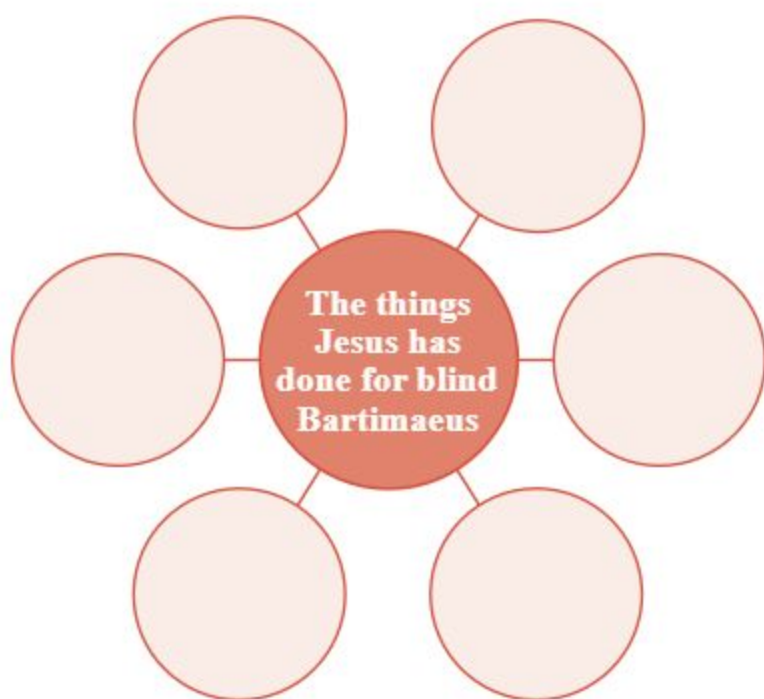

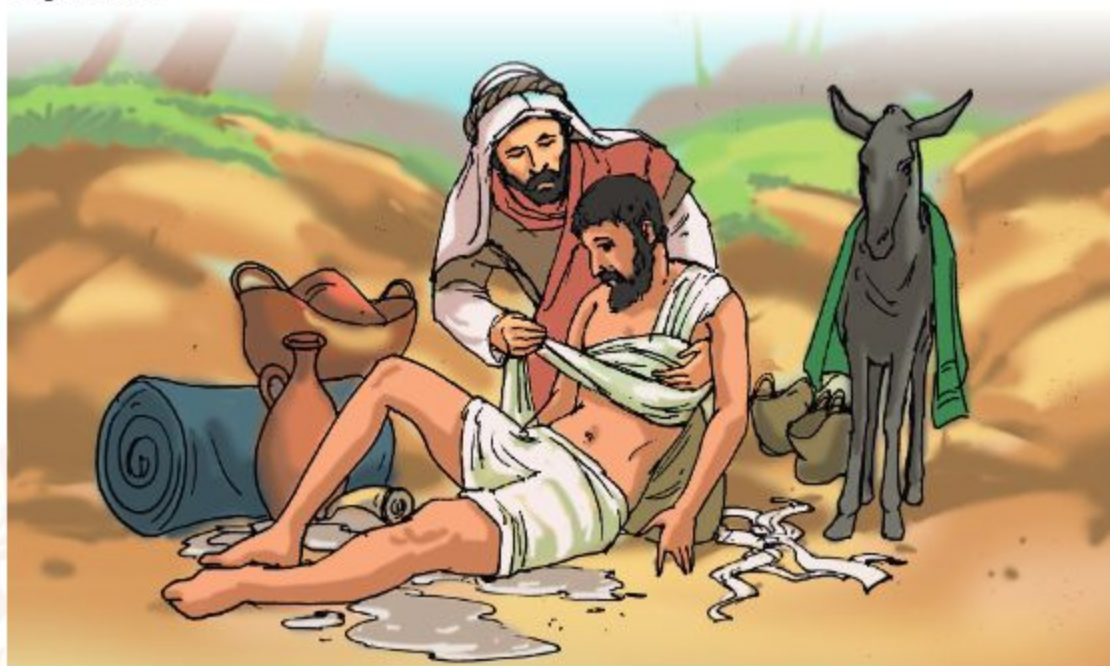
Benevolence and Respect

(Luke 10:25-37)

Once a scribe came to Jesus. To test Jesus, that teacher asked, “Teacher, what shall I do to gain eternal life?”

Jesus is teaching—

Jesus said to him, “What is written in the law of Moses? What did you read there?”

The teacher answered Jesus, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind, and you shall love your neighbor as yourself.”

Jesus said to him, “You have answered correctly. If you keep doing that, you will get life.” To protect his honour, the teacher said to Jesus, “Well, who is my neighbor?”

Jesus answered, “A certain man fell into the hands of robbers as he was going from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped him, beat him up leaving him half dead.

Priests and Levite

Later a priest was passing that way. He saw the man and passed by. Just like that, a Levite came along, went over to the place, saw him and passed by.

The Kind Man

Then a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and grape-juice on his wound

and bandaged it. Then he put him on his own donkey, took him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day the Samaritan took out two dinars, went to the owner of the tavern, and said, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.'



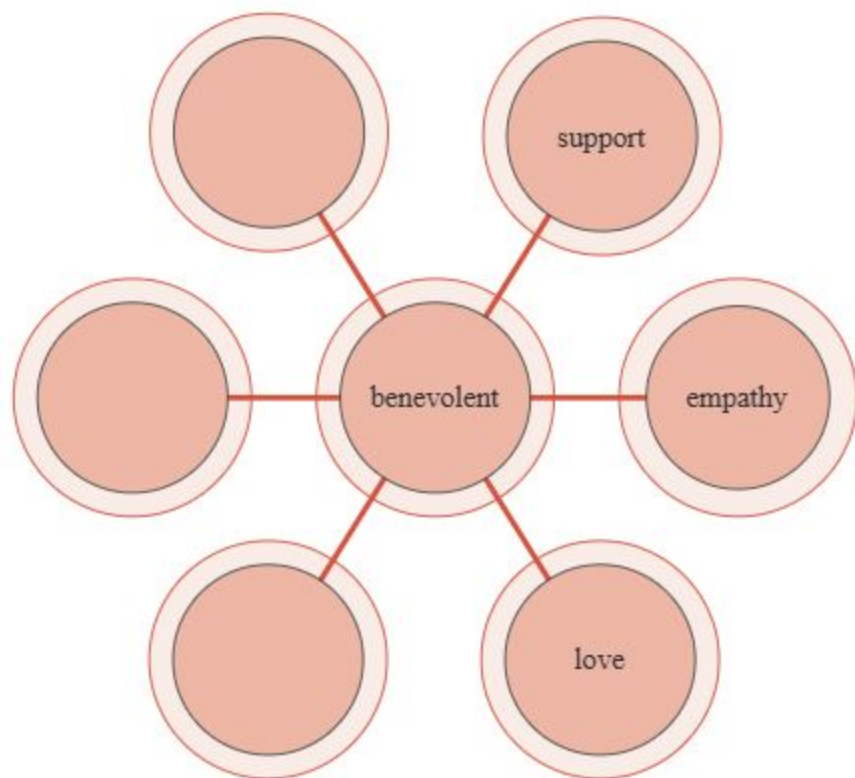

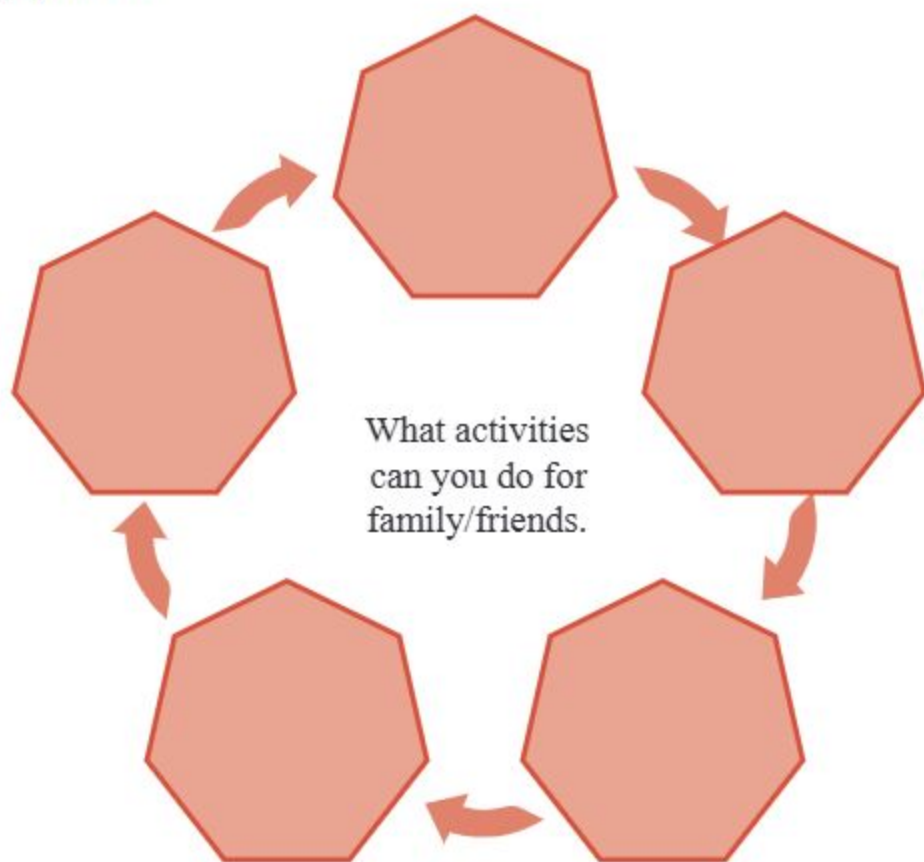
Assistance for repairs to storm damaged homes

In the picture, we see Jesus, Mary and Saint Joseph. Saint Joseph is Mary's husband. Mary became pregnant by the power of the Holy Spirit. Saint Joseph was instructed by the angel of the Lord in a dream to take Mary as his wife and take care of her. Saint Joseph took care of Jesus and Mary when Jesus was born in a manger in Bethlehem. When King Herod wanted to kill Jesus, he again received instructions from the angel in a dream and fled to Egypt with Mary and Jesus. Saint Joseph was a faithful and silent worker, diligent, patient, humble and an honest man. Mary also deeply loved, respected and cared for Joseph and Jesus.

Mary was the wife of Saint Joseph and the mother of Jesus. She was devoted to God, obedient and faithful. She loved Jesus deeply; revered and respected Saint Joseph. Mary was a hard-working, humble and responsible housewife. She lived together with Saint Joseph and Jesus in the Holy Family of Nazareth. Mary was with her son during his suffering and death on the cross. She also made many sacrifices and prayed for the welfare of the whole human race. After Jesus' death, Mary stayed with Jesus' disciples and helped them.

Jesus, the Son of God becomes the son of Mary. Saint Joseph is the foster father of Jesus. Jesus loved his parents. So, in Nazareth, Jesus lived a humble, obedient and faithful life with his parents. At the age of 12, Jesus was lost in the temple in Jerusalem. His parents found him three days later. Then Jesus returned to Nazareth and remained obedient to his parents. He helped his father in carpentry work and his mother in her household chores. Jesus loves all people. But he loves the poor, sick and sinful people more. Jesus, Mary and Saint Joseph adored, respected and loved each other. That is why this family is known as Holy Family.

(Genesis 45:1-15)

Jacob and His Children

Jacob was God's faithful servant. He had 12 sons. He loved his younger son Joseph a bit more. So, others were jealous. One day Joseph saw in a dream that 12 brothers were gathering the bundle of the crops in the field. The bundles of eleven brothers are bowing to his bundle. He shared this dream to his brothers and the brothers became more jealous of him. After a few days, he had another dream. The sun, moon and 11 stars in the sky are bowing to him. He also narrated this dream to his brothers. Now Joseph's brothers were even angrier and wanted to kill him.



Jacob and his sons

One day, Joseph's brothers went far away from home to graze cattle. Father then sent Joseph to inquire. Finding Joseph alone, his brothers sold him to a group of merchants for 20 silver coins. They returned and informed father that a wild animal had killed Joseph. Listening to this, their father suffered a lot and cried. The merchants took Joseph to the land of Egypt and sold him to a royal servant. Joseph worked in the house of the royal servant with honesty and faithfulness.



Showing respect

He grew up in this house. Pharaoh, king of Egypt, had a dream one night and wanted to know its meaning. Joseph interprets and explains the meaning of the Pharaoh's dream. He told that the land will produce many crops for seven years and after seven years there will be famine. Then there will be no food in the country. Then Pharaoh gave Joseph the responsibility to take care of the crops in the coming years.

Joseph with the farmers of the land of Egypt produced a lot of crops for 7 years, filled many granaries. Joseph was an obedient, faithful and humble man. Therefore, he did as the king said. After seven years, when the famine broke out in the countries, Joseph's brothers came to Joseph from the land of Canaan to Egypt to buy food and bowed down to Joseph. Joseph recognized his brothers, but the brothers could not recognize him. Joseph did not reveal his identity. He asked about their family. The brothers said that they had an aged father and the youngest brother at home. Knowing that the old father was still alive, Joseph told them to bring their father and brother when they would come again to buy food. The brothers said that their father is old and the youngest brother had died earlier.

So, they could not come. Joseph then cried out and said, "I am your that brother Joseph, whom you sold." Joseph pulled the brothers close, hugged them and kissed them. His brothers then became afraid. Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid, and do not be sad, because God sent me to this land to save you." Joseph forgave his brothers' all wrongdoings. Joseph brought his father, brothers, their families and livestock to the land of Egypt and settled in a good place.

Jesus obeyed His Father by giving His life on the cross and finally fulfilled His Will. That is why the father gave him his highest honor.

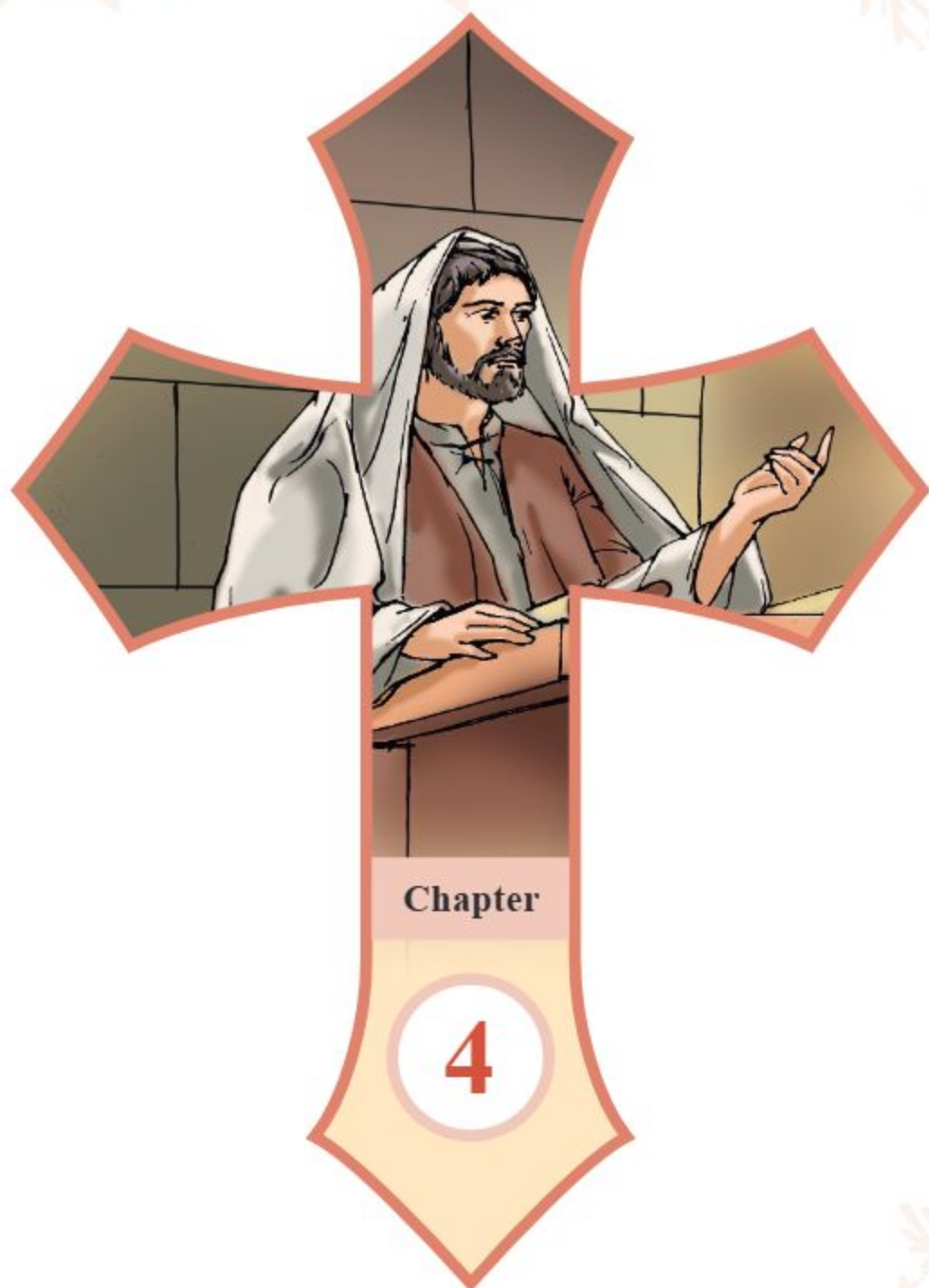

Chapter - 4

Prayer and World Peace

(Matthew 6:9-15)



Lesson: 1

Basic concepts of prayer

People pray to the creator. Not just people but all of creation praise and worship the creator. Praying to the creator is proper and reasonable. Praying is communicating with God and setting up a spiritual relationship with Him. Praying is speaking to God and listening to Him. We pray to God personally, with family, as community, at different religious and social events. Praying is the main part of Christian life. Prayers are very important tools to gain discipline in life and peace in our soul.



Child at prayer

Through prayers God makes a Holy relationship between people and Himself. During times of sorrow and pain they get comfort. They are connected in a deep relationship with family. All of us need to pray. Jesus said, “Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened for you.” (Matthew 7:7). So when you believe and pray to Jesus, He hears your prayers and fulfills it.

It is possible to receive God's grace and guidance only through prayers. The subjects of praise, thanks giving, worship, request, remorse, regret and reconnection through confession can be in prayers. We can also pray silently or verbally, on our knees, standing, sitting, lying face down, through songs and by being with nature. We can pray at any time of the day like in the morning, afternoon, night, at the time of leaving the house, before eating, before going to sleep, and after waking up. We pray during sickness, when in danger, in sadness, when feeling hopeless and when in need.

Here are some prayer ideas from the Holy Bible

- Abraham - Abraham 'pleaded' and prayed to save Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 18:31)
- Daniel - Daniel prayed 'on his knees' three times a day facing the temple of Jerusalem (Daniel 6:10)
- Moses - Moses 'held up his hand' and prayed towards God (Exodus 17:11)
- David - David prayed to God 'weeping' (Psalm 6:8)
- Hannah - Hannah 'kept on praying' to God to take away the misery (1 Samuel 1:12)
- Jesus - In Gethsemane Jesus prayed with 'his face to the ground' (Matthew 26:39)
- The Apostles - Prayed 'together'.

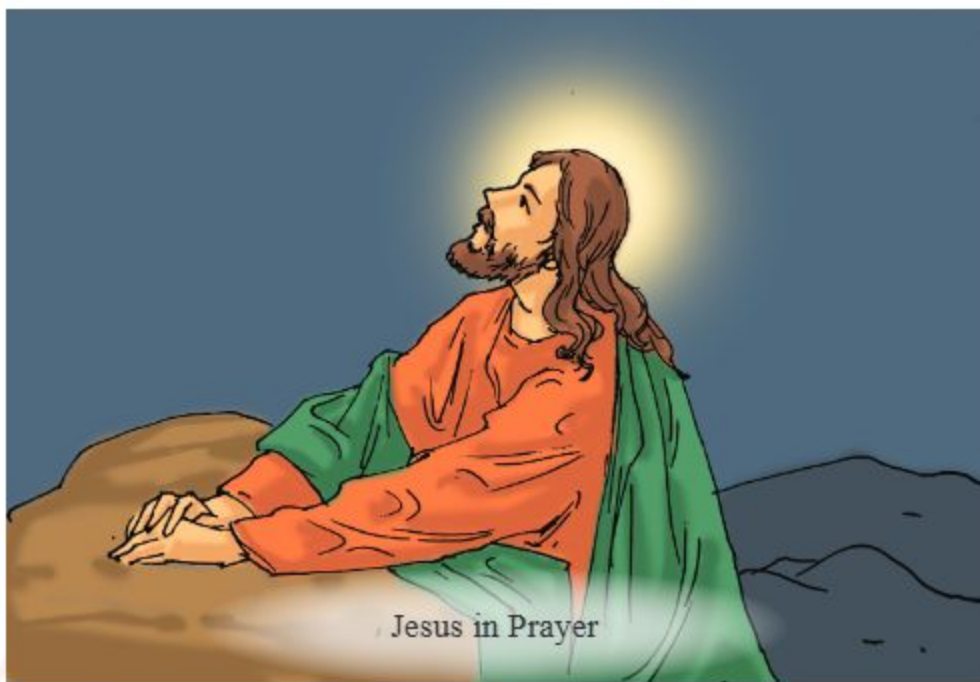

Lesson: 2

Teaching of Jesus about prayer and Lord's Prayer

Jesus would pray all the time to be connected with The Father. He went alone and prayed any time before working, very early in the morning, late at night, in the garden of Gethsemane and in the desert. Through his prayers he asked for strength from the Father. He also taught that to his disciples. The disciples were with Jesus. Jesus advised them in different subjects, like doing religious duties, giving donation, staying on a simple path and praying etc. Jesus told his disciples, 'when you pray do not pray as the pretenders'. They pray to show off. That is why they like to stand on the street corner and pray in public places. So they have already received their reward. He told them, when you pray, pray with the door of your own house closed and call the Lord who stays unseen. He can see everything and gives rewards. Jesus said to pray with a clear mind, in silence and from one's heart. God answers the prayers when it is from one's heart.



The apostles asked Jesus once, "Master teach us how to pray?" So Jesus taught a prayer to his apostles. It is called the "Lord's Prayer".

Our Father, who art in heaven,
Hallowed be thy name,(to be obeyed)
Thy Kingdom come, (kingdom be created)
Thy will be done(fulfilled) on earth,
as it is in heaven,
Give us this day our daily bread(food).
And forgive us
Our sins, as we forgive those who
sins against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
But deliver us from evil (bad).

Amen.

We still call our father and praise him with the prayer Jesus taught us. We pray for fulfillment of wishes and his kingdom. Through this prayer we ask for our daily bread from our father. We pray for our forgiveness the same way we forgive others' faults. We pray so that He may protect us from all the sins and evils.

Lesson: 3

Christian Values

People freely choose a few qualities for their own betterment and for the betterment of the world. If needed they sacrifice anything, they practice that in their own life. These qualities are the values. Because of these values people take vows for the betterment of the world and the people. Jesus Christ himself had many qualities. If we study the life of Christ in the scriptures, we see that Jesus loved and served all the people. He would forgive and heal people. He worked in favour of equality. Jesus taught us to forgive our enemy. It is written in the Holy bible, "If your enemy is hungry, give him food to eat; if he is thirsty, give him water to drink." (Proverbs 25:21). He taught us to show sympathy and be kind towards helpless people. He told us to establish equality and peace. So we will follow the teachings of Jesus to become a fulfilled and good person. Encouraged by Christian values, we will live an honest life. We will try to practice the Christian values in our own lives and in our social lives. He told us to pay taxes. Jesus said, "Then give back to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's." (Luke 20:25). He taught us to respect the emperor of the state and the elders. He played an important role in establishing the rights and respect of women. He did not neglect the tax collector. Jesus wiped out slavery. He established the rights of people. Jesus stayed with people in the time of their need.

He changed their lives. He went to the house of Zacchaeus. Jesus saw Zacchaeus and said, "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today." (Luke 19:5). Jesus stayed with the fishermen, made them his disciples. He cured the sick, forgave the sins of people. Jesus forgave the thief on the cross. He also forgave the people who tortured him. He prayed to God for them. He said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34). He brought salvation for the sinners and gave hope to the hopeless. He accepted foreigners and respected them. He taught us to respect our parents. He sacrificed his life for getting back the people who were lost. So let us build a beautiful society in the light of the Christian values by loving each other and by forgiving.

Lesson: 5

The phrase “Peaceful Coexistence” has an extensive and widespread meaning. Peace cannot be achieved by only living together but also by practicing it in thoughts and implementing it accordingly. If we act in peace, we shall live in peace. A balanced family has such a big influence to the harmony of our church community and society. That is why, a family with peace is highly effective. Fellowship and sacrifice are the two key factors of a peaceful family. If people can live peacefully, only then there is a possibility of peaceful coexistence.

For coexistence, there must be an equal relationship between nations, languages, families, neighbors and cultures. A mutual respect among people is extremely essential. Jesus said, “Love your neighbor as you love yourself” (Luke 10:27). To maintain peace, there must be a combination of endurance, patience, harmony and unity. To live in peace, we must show respect and accept others, whether they are with us or against us. Thus, we can coexist.

During the different religious festivals, we share our joy among others. Every religion advises us to coexist peacefully. Below the philosophy of four different religions is described briefly –



Religious harmony

Peaceful coexistence in Christianity

About coexistence, bible says, “Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse.” (Romans 12:14). “17 Repay no evil for evil. Have regard for good things in the sight of all men. “18 If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peacefully with all men.” (Romans 12:17-18). “But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also.” (Matthew 5:39). “23 Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the sacrificial stone and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you.” “24 leave your gift there in front of the sacrificial stone. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift.” (Matthew 5:23-24).

Peaceful coexistence in Islam

Quran is the holy book for Islam. It is written, “O mankind, We created you all from a male and a female, and made you into nations and tribes so that you may know one another.” This verse clearly indicates that there should not be any

discrimination based on clan, creed, race or religion. It is derived from an Arabic stem that the meaning of Islam is “peace”. The Charter of Medina, declared by the Prophet Muhammad (SAW) in 622 A.D., is the best example to establish communal coexistence of different beliefs.

Peaceful coexistence in Hinduism

Mahatma Gandhi adopted non-violence as the sole purpose of his philosophy and manner of living. Bhagavad Gita is the holy book of Hinduism. It teaches that violence in any form is wrong and a bad action, whether it be fighting in a war or harming a small living creature. For the safeguard of justice, security and righteousness, coexistence is the only way taught in Bhagavad Gita.

Peaceful coexistence in Buddhism

The Buddhism taught us about self-control, self-restraint and tolerance, which are the basic and essential ingredients for good relations and peaceful coexistence among nations. The basic teaching of Buddhism promotes peaceful coexistence from different perspectives. It highlights equity and compassion. To deal with religious conflicts, the Buddhism practices the process of equity, alliance and harmony. In addition, it believes in united peaceful coexistence.

We should be respectful to each other's religion by learning the main purposes of these four religions. It will help us to live peacefully with each other.

This peace and unity gradually spreads towards other religions and countries. If inter-religious conflict can be reduced significantly, it would be much easier to establish religious harmony.

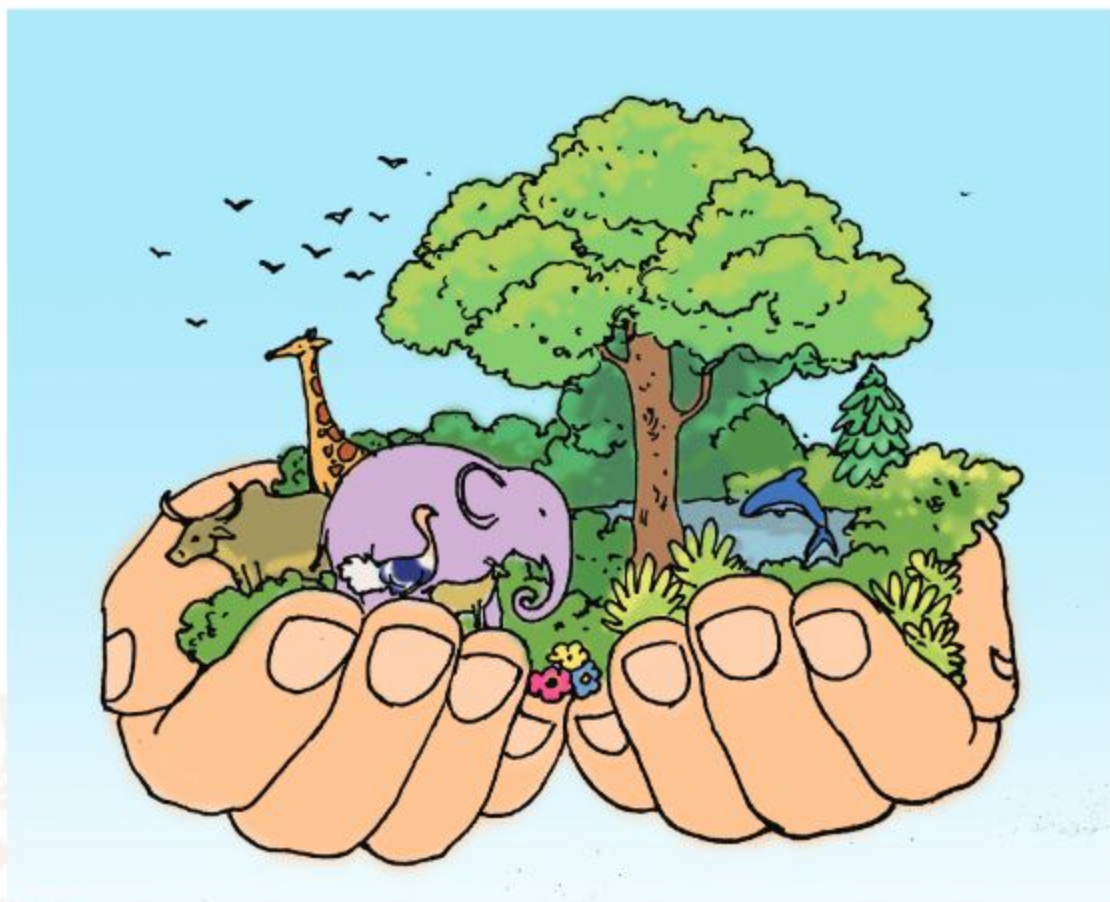

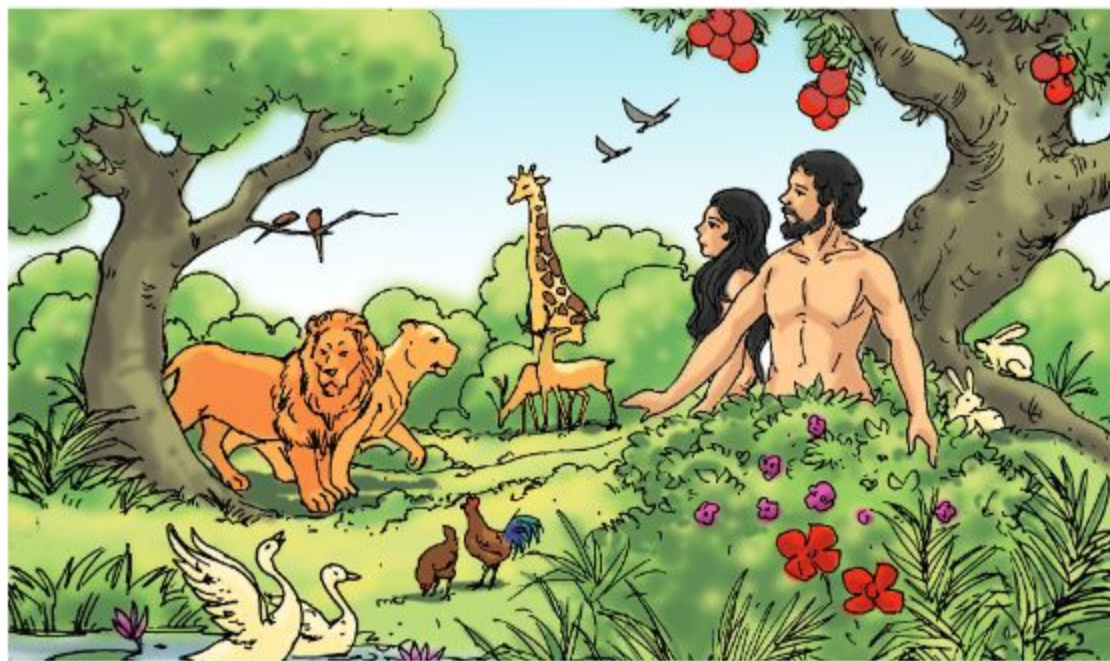
Lesson: 3

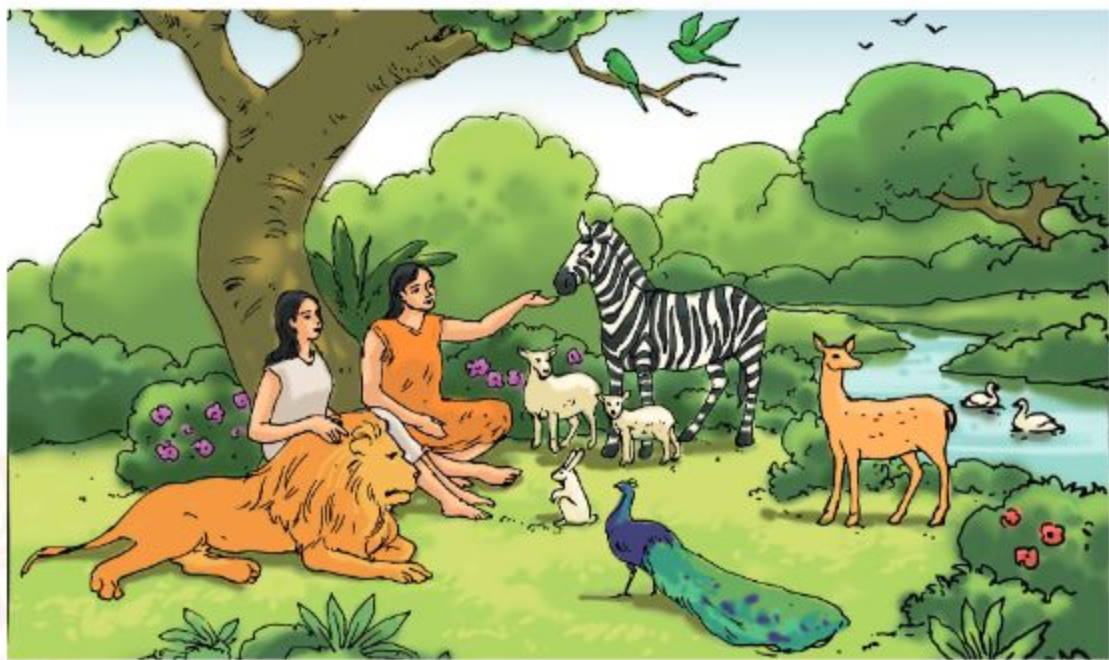
Lesson: 4

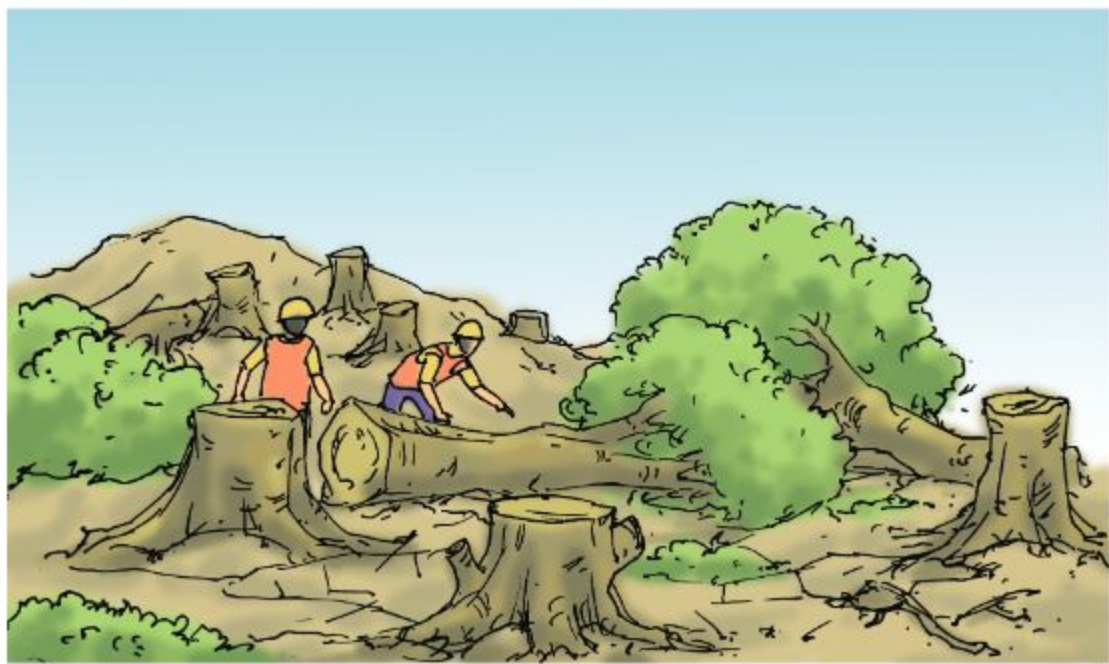

Care for nature

It is written in the Holy Bible-

When you see a bird's nest on a tree or on the ground with chicks or eggs in it, and the birds are hatching on those chicks or eggs, you shall not catch the bird with the chicks. You may take the babies for yourself, but you must leave the bird, so that you may have good and long life. (Deuteronomy: 22:6-11).

Congregational Education

Seeing the destruction of nature and the living world, Pope Francis, the head of the Catholic Church, became very worried and disturbed. He wrote a public epistle called 'Praise be to you'. In this letter, he gives instructions on how to take care of our identical homestead. He appealed to all to protect and care for Mother Earth, nature and the living world. This letter has gained acceptance among people worldwide. The world has understood its need and importance during this crisis. In this letter, he wrote:

- ❖ Everything in the world is interconnected.
- ❖ All creation speaks of God's infinite love and affection.
- ❖ The goal of all creation is one and the same, that is God Himself.
- ❖ Humans are guilty for destroying God's created biodiversity.
- ❖ Destruction of forests, land and wetlands is a sin.
- ❖ Above all, doing wrong against nature and the living world is a sin against ourselves and against God.
- ❖ Call to change mind set regarding environmental issues.
- ❖ Man cannot destroy the order that God has fixed during the creation of nature and environment.

How we can take care of the biosphere and nature

- ❖ Cleanliness: One should try to follow the cleanliness of oneself, one's home, school, place of worship and surroundings to keep the environment clean.
- ❖ Waste Prevention: Avoiding unnecessary spending. Being frugal in the use of water, electricity and other resources.
- ❖ Reducing Environment Pollution:
- ❖ Avoiding activities and behaviors that pollute the environment.
- ❖ Avoiding the use of plastic products.
- ❖ Consuming healthy food.

- ❖ Planting trees in homes and institutions.
- ❖ Learning and being aware of nature and environment.
- ❖ Avoiding the killing of animals and birds unnecessarily.
